Welcome to Craft Alliance Summer Art Camps for Ages 4 – 18

Our 2012 Summer Studios Camp Program is packed with fun activities and creative art experiences for all age groups of children and teens. Each camper will have a hot time in our cool, air conditioned studios this summer with a unique arts experience, from learning techniques of clay, glass, graphics and metal arts to exploring wearable art, fiber materials and more. There are one-week half-day camps from June 6 through August 10, and supervised lunchtime is free for campers staying all day. Before and after-care are available for an additional fee. Craft Alliance has two locations: 6640 Delmar Blvd located in the Delmar Loop, and 501 N Grand Blvd located in the Kranzberg Arts Center in Grand Center.

Our late afternoon Teen Camps meet for one week sessions, Monday through Friday, and are classes that allow ages 14-18 to focus on creative techniques in metal, glass, graphics and clay. Again this summer, there is the opportunity for teens, ages 15-18, to be volunteer interns in the day camps and earn class credits to participate in the teen classes. Upon registration, you will receive an informational packet in the mail. Please return the required documents prior to the start of your child's camp. **Parents, when arriving** for camp on the first day, please bring your camper into the building to help them find the correct studio and meet the instructor. For those using before care service, you will be asked to sign your child in each morning. On the first day, parents may stay for the first 30 minutes of the camp to meet the instructors and the other campers. Because the camp experience is specifically designed for children, our policy is that parents may not remain in the studios for the duration of the camp session. **Parents, when leaving**, please come into the building to pick up the younger camper. After-care parents will need to sign out the camper each day. Children under 11 will not be allowed to leave the Delmar building without a parent.

Thank you for taking part in our 2012 Craft Alliance Art Camps and we are looking forward to terrific summer experience with your child.

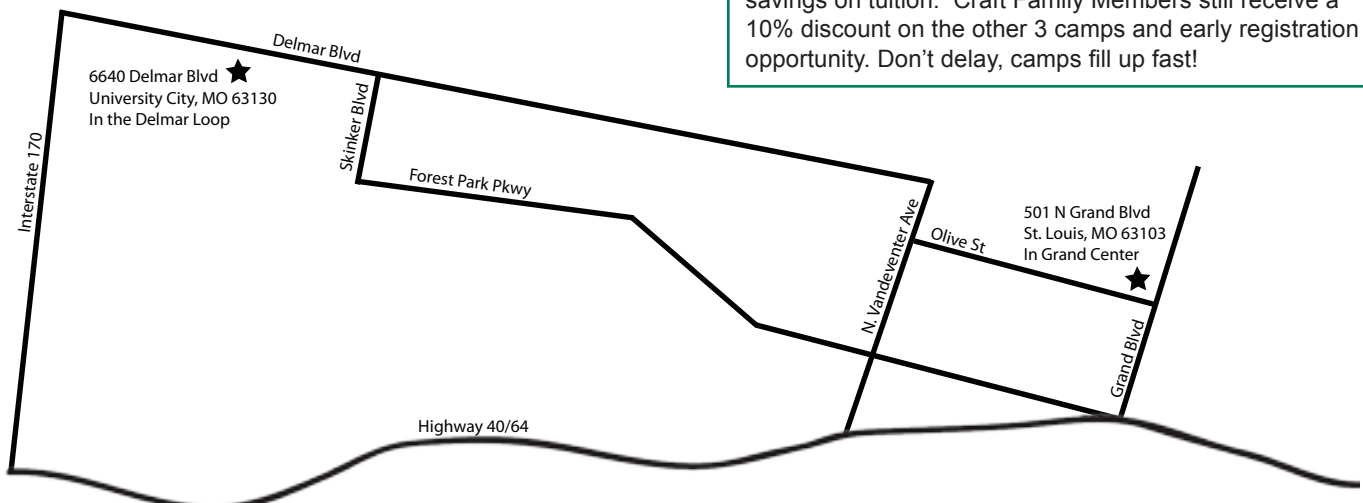

Registration begins **February 20, 2012** for **Craft Family** Members of Craft Alliance and **March 19, 2012** for Non-Members. **Register on-line, by fax, mail or walk-in.** Membership and registration details are located next to the registration form. Please read all Registration Policies and Procedures carefully before you register. **NO telephone registrations.**

Craft Alliance Summer camps are fun and active. **For safety, no sandals or crocs should be worn, only close-toed shoes allowed.** Campers should dress for fun arts experiences and should bring a snack and a drink for each half-day-camp, or snacks and lunch with a drink, if they are enrolled for a full day. **Campers in the Glass Beads and Glass Explorations camps should dress in long cotton pants.**

Summer camps are in session for a total of 10 weeks, one week half-day camps available. Each half-day camp meets for a full 3 hours. Put two together and spend the entire day being creative!

Times:

Morning camps are from 9A-12N, afternoon camps meet from 12:45-3:45P. Teen Camps are from 4:00-5:45P.

Lunch:

There is a 45-minute supervised lunch from 12N until 12:45P, free for full day campers, \$15 per week for half-day campers. Students must bring their own lunch and drink. At the Delmar location only, full-day campers, ages 11-14, with parent's permission may leave the Craft Alliance building for lunch.

Before and After-Care:

Before-care is available from 8:30-9A for **\$10 per week.**

After-care is available from 3:45-5:30P for **\$35 per week.**

Cost for both **Before-** and **After-care** is **\$45 per week.**

Class Size/Ages:

Class sizes are kept small to provide the best camp experience. Enrollment is limited to 10 students per camp unless otherwise noted.

Clay Pick-up:

Because of longer drying and firing times, finished clay projects will be available two weeks following the last day of the camp session your child is enrolled in. The instructors will give specific times for pick-up. Craft Alliance will not be responsible for any work left after September 14, 2012.

Parents:

Our professional artist-instructors and teen interns will supervise children during all indoor and outdoor camp activities. If you have any questions, please call the Registrar at 314-725-1177, ext. 325.

Scholarships:

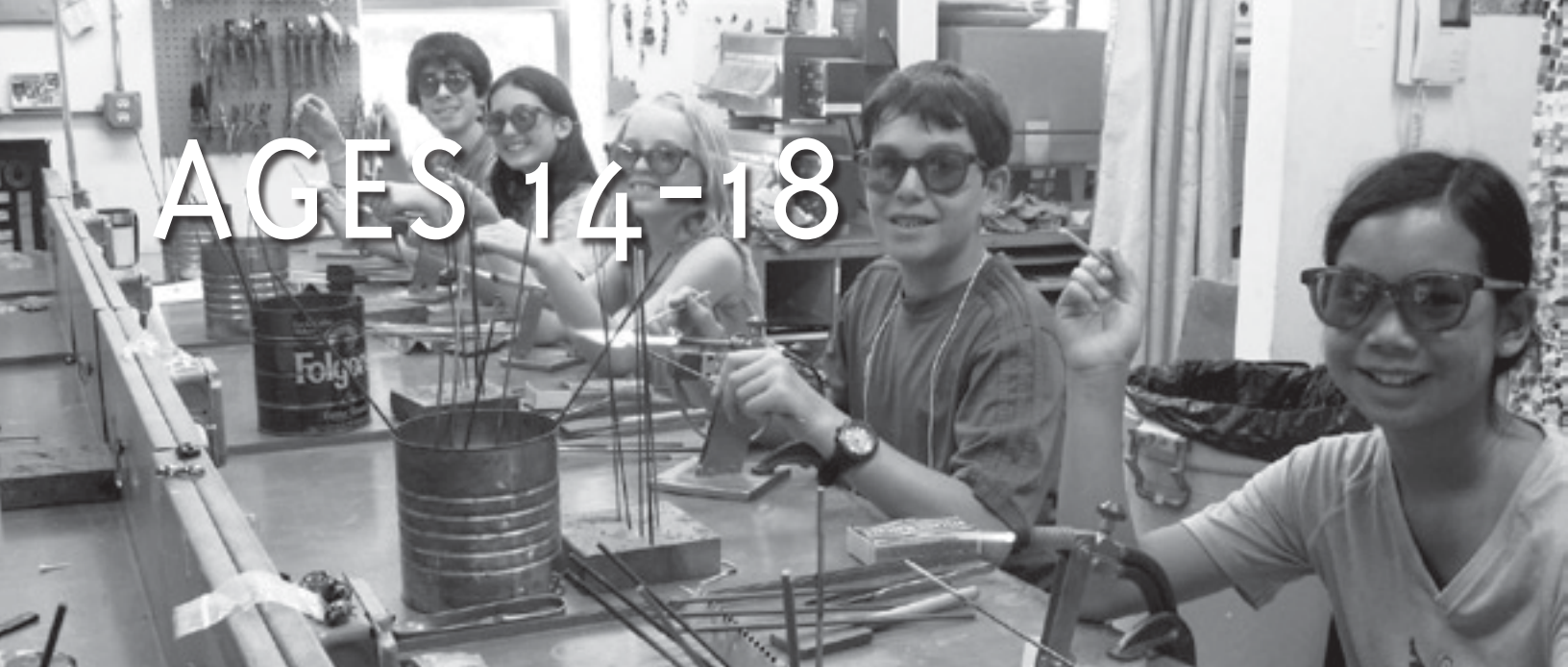
